Call For Entries Ceramics Exhibit at Franklin Park Conservatory and Botanical Gardens

Columbus, OH—Franklin Park Conservatory and Botanical Gardens, in partnership with the Central Ohio Clay Arts guild, is seeking contemporary ceramic works for a juried art exhibit.

Artwork submitted should reference the themes of the natural world, the balance of nature, or the intricate connections between humans and the botanical world.

The deadline to submit entries is October 5, 2015. The exhibit is curated by Eric Rausch, ceramic artist and member of the Central Ohio Clay Arts guild. Sherrie Riley Hawk, owner of Sherrie Gallerie in Columbus, OH, will sit on the jury panel. A prize of \$500 will be awarded to the artist whose work is selected as Best in Show and two works will be awarded Honorable Mention prizes of \$250.

De La Naturaleza is on view January 9–March 6, 2016 in the Conservatory's Cardinal Health Gallery. The gallery exhibit coincides with the Conservatory's *Orchids* exhibition, an annual horticulture display that celebrates the beauty and form of the orchid with a display of thousands of orchid blooms.
